> Being female > Increasing age

- > Personal/family history of breast
- conditions/breast cancer
- > Genetic risk factors (BRCA1 & BRCA2) > Obesity
- > Beginning menopause at an older age
- > Beginning your period before age 12
- > Having your first child after the age of 30 > Never having a full-term pregnancy
- > Postmenopausal hormone therapy
- > Drinking alcohol




